SIGNIFICANT ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Participation rates for both girls and boys' sports were at the highest level since tracking numbers in 1995.

Kyle Ferguson won the Division 2 State bowling individual Championship.

Bethany Beachum broke school records in the 100m, 200 m, and 400 m run in track, and finished third and fourth in the state meet in the 100 and 200 respectively.

Billy Stone was the GMAA Cross Country Champion. He also won the 1600 m run in GMAA Track.

Fruitport's volleyball team reached the *final four*.

Five students attended the Women in Sports Leadership Conference in Lansing in February.

Fruitport hosted Regional Volleyball Championships for the first time ever.

Fruitport hosted baseball and softball districts for the first time ever.

Fruitport hosted GMAA Track, WWAC track, and District Girls soccer as well.

Freshman Jen Cavanaugh set a new girls golf record for 9 holes, and senior Melissa Bodin set a record for 18 holes.

Fruitport stated the lengthy process of applying for certification of its athletic program through the Michigan Athletic Administrator's Association. This process will continue in 06-07.

The Fruitport Athletic Foundation approved over \$10,000 for 2006-07 coach's requests grades 7-12 athletics.

In May, the school Board approved the addition of Varsity Competitive Cheer for the 2006-07 season, resulting in 10 sports offerings for each gender.

Coach Randy Johnson was recognized as WWAC Girls Coach of The Year for Spring 2006.

Coach Dave Hulings was the Chronicle's Division 1 and 2 Girls Soccer Coach of the Year.
